


3. The Father _____ the Son, implying sweet _____ and _____ between them, verse 20

(John 20:30-31) "And truly Jesus did many other signs in the presence of His disciples, which are not written in this book; {31} but these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in His name."

(John 21:24-25) "This is the disciple who testifies of these things, and wrote these things; and we know that his testimony is true. {25} And there are also many other things that Jesus did, which if they were written one by one, I suppose that even the world itself could not contain the books that would be written. Amen."

(Matthew 4:23) "And Jesus went about all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing all kinds of sickness and all kinds of disease among the people."

(Matthew 9:35) "Then Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing every sickness and every disease among the people."

(Luke 6:1) "Now it happened on the second Sabbath after the first that He went through the grainfields. ..."



(Matthew 26:39) ". "O My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from Me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as You will. ""

(Matthew 16:17) ". "Blessed are you, Simon Bar-Jonah, for flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but My Father who is in heaven."
