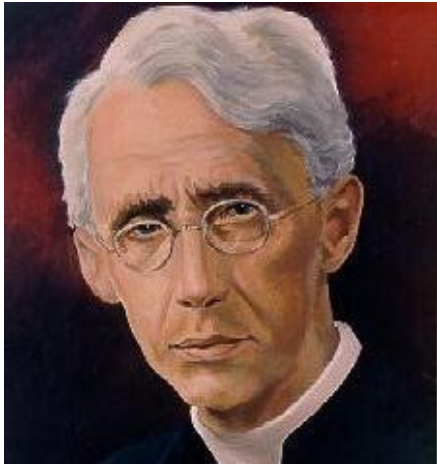


#3. Trust Him to \_\_\_\_\_ : He will! verses 29-31

## Intimidation II

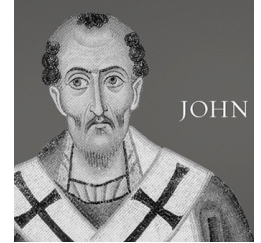
From 2 Kings 18-19 we can draw out 3 helpful principles regarding intimidation:

1. Expect intimidation from the world, 18:17-37
2. Take your concerns to the Lord in prayer, 19:1-19 [last time]

**(1 Peter 5:7)** casting all your care upon Him, for He cares for you.

3. He will defend His own name: trust Him

In 2 Kings 19:20-37 we can observe 4 ways in which the Lord defends His own name, (which gives us four good reasons to trust Him):



#1. Trust Him to \_\_\_\_\_ : He will!

verses 1-2, 15-20

**(1 John 5:14-15)** Now this is the confidence that we have in Him, that if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us. [15] And if we know that He hears us, whatever we ask, we know that we have the petitions that we have asked of Him.



#2. Trust Him to deal with your \_\_\_\_\_ : He will!

verses 21-28

**(Matthew 7:2)** For with what judgment you judge, you will be judged; and with the measure you use, it will be measured back to you.  
**(1 Peter 2:21-23)** For to this you were called, because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that you should follow His steps: [22] "WHO COMMITTED NO SIN, NOR WAS DECEIT FOUND IN HIS MOUTH"; [23] who, when He was reviled, did not revile in return; when He suffered, He did not threaten, but committed Himself to Him who judges righteously;
